#### The Six Levels of Patience

#### Worldview #1—This too will pass.

Takpay dak gi tongwa.

Things are empty of any self-nature of being unchanging.

#### Worldview #2—I cannot control this in the present moment.

Rangwang chen gyi dak gi tongwa.

Things are empty of any self-nature of being independent.

#### Worldview #3—I have put this and myself here.

Suk dang sukndzin gyi tsema dze shen gyi tongwa.

What is seen, and what sees it, are empty of coming from separate karmic causes.

# Worldview #4—There is somebody who would find this pleasant.

Ta-nye jukpay jukshir rang gi tsennyi kyi drupe tongwa.

Things are empty of automatically being the thing that is called their name.

### Worldview #5—I can use this problem as a path.

Lo nume la nangway wang gi shak tsam mayinpar yul rang gi tunmong mayinpay duluk su drupe tongwa.

Things are empty of having any unique way of being from their own side, rather than simply being established by virtue of their appearing to an unaffected state of mind.

## Worldview #6—We must be as gardeners.

Rang ngu ne drupe tongware rang gi chashe la ten ne ming de taktsam du druppa. Things are empty of any existence from their own side; rather, they exist only as parts of things that I group together and apply a name or mental image of the thing, forced to do so depending on whether I have, every day, taken care of others or not.
